Manual-Shield Tunnelling Construction

This northern section of the tunnel had to be excavated using a tunnelling shield to bore through solid earth. A formwork shield served as a temporary support structure that protected the workers from caveins as they laboured within it, digging the tunnel out in front of them.

The stone tunnel structure was built by masons at the trailing end of the shield, and the shield was then jacked forward as excavation continued.

This technique was the forerunner of modern tunnel-boring machines.
